WASP Florence "Shutsy" Reynolds Dies

Florence "Shutsy" Reynolds of Connellsville, Penn., passed away Thursday, March 15, 2018, at home. She was 95. She took a Civilian Pilot Training Program at her local airport in Connellsville and completed it, receiving her pilot's certificate at the end.

Her duties included flight testing planes, ferrying aircraft from repair stops and transporting people and materials for the war effort. Reynolds recalled fondly her time flying the WASPs as "the closest thing to God. I've always felt that way. There's nothing like it, especially when you're on a solo flight." Shutsy Reynolds once spoke in front of our chapter and she was a classy, proud lady. She was an inspiration to many women.
