Next meeting will be a Board Meeting on Friday, February 9th.


The following General Membership meeting is on February 16th, 2018

PASS IT FORWARD TABLE



For this reason, the chapter is embarking on a plan to develop this social media through a Facebook page on the internet.

Some of you would naturally welcome a Facebook connection because you already use this platform to stay in touch with other groups, friends and family members. But to many of you members out there, Facebook sounds foreign and something you want nothing to do with, yet Facebook, like airplanes has come a long way and is now the standard for staying in touch.
