MVRC regular monthly meeting at Rostraver Municipal Building on Friday, <u>April 12th</u> at 7:30 PM

One can see the many items and situations that have to be discussed and planned for an official event to occur involving our clubs and Westmoreland County Parks. Enclosed are email conversations between LHMAC, Al Kozusko, and County Parks Personal. We thank LHMAC for going to the forefront and hope for a good turnout at the float flys. One hopes that all members appreciate the work that Al is accomplishing as president of MVRC.

Al Greg McCloskey confirmed the dates for the float flys, they are as follows: Saturday, June 8 (rain date: Saturday, June 15); Saturday, August 3 (rain date: Saturday, August 10). The time for both days is 10:00 AM - 6:00PM. We will need to post signs at Acme at least one week prior to these dates. Also, I will fill-in the park permit application. We will also need special events insurance from AMA. I will contact them to see if one special-events insurance is sufficient to cover both days, if not, perhaps your club could pay for one event. I will be in contact with you with more details in due time. Thanks Rene

At our last meeting a couple of questions regarding the float fly were posed. 1) Can we charge a landing fee (\$2.00 or \$3.00) for people who actually fly? 2) Can we allow radio-controlled boats; the members were leaning to RC planes only? 3) Since these events will be posted on our websites, this will open the prospect of members from other clubs to come and fly, are these float flys only limited to LHMAC and Mon-Valley? Between Al Kozusko and myself we will establish rules ensuring that all safety precautions are followed as we do at the flying fields. I will be filling in the application for permit in a couple of weeks and will provide you with the AMA liability policy for special events. Thank You for your time and consideration. Have a nice day. 1. Yes, you can charge a fee to participants. 2. Yes, you can allow radio-controlled boats. We are considering possibly suspending boating at the lake for those 2 days to avoid any conflicts. 3. You may allow anyone to fly as long as you control the event.

When you file your permit application please include all these items and I will respond with a letter/permit detailing all these various items and I will then copy that to our Park Police and Park Staff so that everyone is totally aware and informed.

I would like to do the same thing regarding your Sept. event for Giant Scale models at your field in Cedar Creek so please file that permit application listing all the various things we discussed like camping, night flying, etc and I will respond in a like manner.

President's Corner

Fellow MVRC Members:

I would like to think that the good weather is right around the corner. This recent spring snow is certainly a big surprise. Hopefully April will be a good month for flying. Don't forget to thoroughly check your aircraft before flying. Lots of us have simply store our aircraft for the winter and just charge the battery and go fly, NOT A GOOD IDEA! Here is a checklist:

- 1. Fuel proof all areas exposed to fuel or exhaust residue such as the firewall and engine compartment, fuel tank compartment, flap area, wing saddle area, and wheel wells.
- 2. Check the C.G. according to the measurements provided in the manual for the plane.
- 3. Secure the battery and receiver with a strip of balsa or plywood or Velcro strap. Simply stuffing them into place with foam rubber is not sufficient. These items can change the C.G. if they move around in flight.
- 4. Extend your receiver antenna and make sure it has a strain relief inside the fuselage to keep tension off of the solder joint inside the receiver (applies to 72 MHz). For 2.4 GHz receivers, follow the instructions that came with the receiver.

- 5. Balance your model laterally. You want a model that doesn't dip to one wing when you hold the nose and tail (this is the "roll axis")
- 6. Secure critical fasteners with thread locking compound (the screws that hold the engine to the firewall, set screws on wheel collars, screw-lock pushrod connectors, etc.)
- 7. Add a drop of oil to the axles so the wheels turn freely.
- 8. Make sure all hinges are securely glued in place. Pull on the control surfaces and check for security.
- 9. Reinforce holes for wood screws with thin CA (control horns, servo hatches, landing gear straps)
- 10. Confirm that all controls operate in the correct direction and the throws are in accordance with the instruction manual.
- 11. Make sure there are silicone retainers on all clevises.
- 12. Fasten all servo arms to the servos with the screws included with the
- 13. Secure connections between servo wires and Y-connectors or servo extensions and the connection between your battery pack and the on/off switch with vinyl tape or heat shrink tubing.
- 14. Make sure any servo extensions and other wiring doesn't inter-fere with the movement of servo arms, landing gear, pushrods, etc.

15. Make sure fuel lines and pressure lines are properly connected and not kinked

16. Balance your propeller (and spare props).

17. Tighten propeller nuts and spinners.

18. Place your name, address, AMA number and telephone number on or inside your model.

19. Cycle your battery packs in receiver and transmitter and make sure they are fully charged.

20. When you get to the flying field, range check your radio and make sure everything is working properly.

- The EC recommends the following addition to the bylaws. If any elected position becomes available for any reason the following procedure will be followed. The position(s) will be advertised in the next newsletter. Nominations will be taken and elections will take place at the next meeting.
- Before the EC recommends for or against purchasing insurance on the contents of our building it would like to see all the information from Erie in written form and also would like to know if it would be possible to reduce the \$20,000 coverage to lower the premium.
- The EC recommends a spotter when flying on very busy flying days.
- The EC said that no one should have to wait an extended time to fly- please be considerate.
- The EC recommends calling takeoffs and landings and flying the pattern.
- The EC would like to remind members that we must use the pilot stations for safety. It was discussed that at times you do not know who is flying when you are not flying from the pilot stations. We must help each other obey the rules, be considerate, understanding and respectful of each others proficiency of flying.
- The EC recommends using the area to the upper left for 3D airplane and helicopter flying especially during busy flying days.
- The EC would also like to remind all members to obey all park rules such as all animals must be on a leash and not allowed to roam freely.
