






































Meet Harry, My "Accidental" Service Dog

Man's Best Friend...Service Dog "Harry"



Harry is a little over 3 years old.

Harry is my "accidental" service dog. He was a birthday gift from me to my wife Margaret. When he was about 6-8 months old, she noticed that he was very interested in me before I would have a seizure. He gives me about 10-15 minutes advanced notice and I am able to get myself in a safe location. If Margaret is not close at hand, Harry will bark to alert her. After discovering his abilities, we hired a professional trainer for him. Margaret did a lot of the training with the guidance of the pro. Service dog training is very expensive and time consuming.

Harry has never missed a seizure, not once. He has given me new confidence to leave our home, knowing that I will not hurt myself. He also seems to know when I am dizzy and will plant his paws as best he can and I can hold on to him to keep from falling. He is awesome on snow and ice. Generally, Harry sleeps at the foot of our bed, on the floor. If he sleeps on the bed next to me, I know I'm going to have a rough night and he is watching over me.

Harry is a Eurasier. The breed is much more common in Europe; they were developed in Germany in the early 1960s. The original stock came from the Wolfspitz {Keeshond}, Chow, and Samoyed. They have been selectively bred to be companion dogs, they have very little prey drive; they are not hunters. Harry and I were on a walk and he approached 3-4 baby birds that had apparently fledged too early and they seemed unable to fly. Mom was with the babies. Harry trotted up to them, merely sniffed them for a few seconds, and moved on, he had zero interest in harming the birds.

Eurasiers have little to no guard instincts, they will bark at strangers and are at first, wary. They are ideal family dogs since they become very fond of the entire household. They get along well with other household pets, including cats.
